Summary of spending	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • To improve reading and writing, small groups of pupils were placed into Literacy lessons which were delivered by the English department. • The school has invested in ‘accelerated reader’ and purchase of texts to support the delivery. • Use of ‘Lexia’ programme and purchase of small laptops to enable easier access. • The hegartymaths online programme has been developed. • One to one support has been given to pupils in maths and English lessons. • One to one tuition has been in place for pupils identified to have the highest need. • Reading pens purchased.

	<p>Of the 28 pupils who did not reach the expected level for reading in Y6, 26 of these pupils have now reached the expected level.</p> <p>The 2 pupils who have failed to reach the expected level will continue in Y8 with intensive literacy lesson in place of French.</p>	<p>Of the 24 pupils who did not reach the expected level for mathematics in Y6, 23 of these pupils have now reached the expected level.</p> <p>The pupil who has failed to reach the expected level will have one to one support in mathematics lessons.</p>
